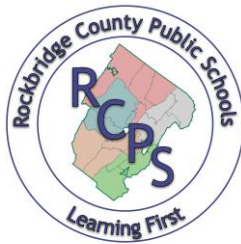

Good afternoon,

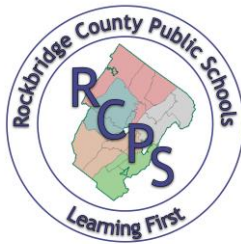
This morning, the Rockbridge County School Board met to discuss and take action on the learning plan model we will be implementing at the start of the 2nd nine-weeks which begins on Tuesday, November 10th. Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, the physical, mental, social and emotional health of everyone remains extremely important to us and we do not take this responsibility lightly.

The learning plan the School Board adopted today is what was labeled the Option 2 - "Staggered Hybrid Plan".

Here are the key components of this newly adopted plan:
